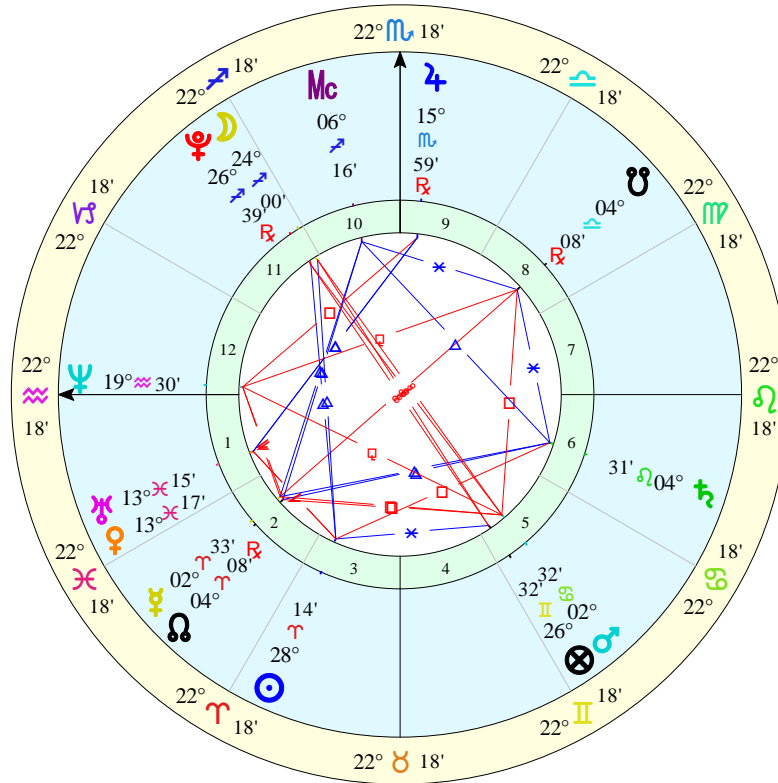

Family and Friends

The Moon

The Moon tells you about your children's emotional nature and basic needs. It is also the key to how they experience intimacy in relationships. The Moon tells you about your children's relationship with their mother, how they experience their mother's nurturing. As a result it can also give you insights on how to best nurture your children as babies and maturing young adults. When a child feels safe and has their basic needs met, they are better able to achieve their goals later in life.

The Moon is in Sagittarius

Baby Suri is adventurous and boisterous, liking nothing better than to spend hours playing with her parents, siblings and friends. Suri needs to feel genuinely loved and thrives in a warm and nurturing environment. She invents plenty of antics to gain other people's attention. As a baby and a young child Suri enjoys spontaneous outings rather than being settled into a routine. Even a trip to the supermarket can be an adventure with Suri in tow. Parents need to aware of Suri's need to explore, providing safe boundaries. This is a child who will jump from one activity to another without necessarily showing caution.

Learning to read is an important step in young Suri's life, providing hours of comfort and nurturing her need for exploring different realms. For this reason a varied library is a great resource, as well as puzzles, games and videos. However, it is the outings to the zoo, park and playgrounds that really excite Suri. Depending on other aspects of baby Suri's chart, she enjoys an independent mother. In fact it is likely that her mother is an enthusiastic and enterprising woman, who enjoys young Suri and also feels comfortable leaving her occasionally with other warm and loving caretakers.

The Moon is in the 11th House

Friends have a strong influence on Suri throughout her life. As a baby many friends of the family show an interest in her birth. Births of other family members and associates may coincide with Suri's arrival. As a result she enjoys the company of other children from a young age. As she grows older her home is likely to be a place where her friends congregate.

Therefore it is important that her parents ensure that young Suri is encouraged to attract genuine, loving friends who have a positive influence on young Suri's life. Most children are influenced to some extent by their friends, but Suri is more sensitive than most. She learns habits and values from her friends, even at a young age. This could be a problem in teenage years when peers play such a prominent role. However, early intervention by parents to encourage good values and friendships is likely to have a positive effect on Suri's life. Her mother may have more influence in this area of Suri's life than other members of the family.

Suri may be more gregarious than most other children and need the stimulation of playmates before school age. Suri benefits from joining social groups when young. These can range from taking part in her mother's activities where other children gather, or joining a community group such as scouts or brownies. The sign of Suri's Moon influences the extent to which she is extroverted. A child with a Moon in the sign of Leo, Sagittarius, Gemini, Libra or Aquarius is more likely to enjoy lively interaction with many other children away from their home. However, a child with a Moon in the sign of Aries, Taurus, Virgo, Capricorn, Cancer, Scorpio or Pisces may prefer socialising with other children in a quiet and ordered environment in their own room.

Venus

The planet Venus describes your children's personal relationships with family and friends. Like a Moon, Venus is important in describing how your child prefers to interact. This planet also gives vital information about your child's receptivity to love. This is important because a child feels loved in different ways. Some children feel cherished when loved ones are paying them lots of attention, whereas others feel most loved when given the freedom to go their separate ways. Therefore gaining an understanding of the planet Venus in your child's chart can give you insights into how to encourage rewarding relationships with family and friends.

Venus is in Pisces

Astrologers consider the planet Venus to be well placed in the sign of Pisces resulting in satisfying relationships with friends and family. Suri is a warm and loving child, enjoying intimate relationships with loved ones. Suri is a sensitive child, able to understand the feelings of loved ones. However, she is easily hurt by harsh words. Suri likes harmonious interaction, and often tries to escape into a world of her own if confronted with an angry companion. Once the mood has calmed down, then Suri is ready to play again. She has a very forgiving nature, except under extreme circumstances. Even at a young age Suri is likely to understand the nuances of relationships, possessing an ability to listen to and appreciate other people. Suri is a little helper around the home and enjoys social contact.

There is a tendency for young Suri to look after her friends and family members a little too much at times. Parents and mentors need to encourage Suri to learn to discriminate between those who want and need help, and those who are better left alone. They also need to ensure that Suri is not put in the position of prematurely caring for older members of the family. In other words parents and mentors need to be wary of relying too heavily on Suri's kind and forgiving nature. Young Suri benefits from a warm and cuddly pet. The unconditional love of a pet is a great source of comfort. In turn Suri is happy to spend time looking after a pet. She may also enjoy water activities including joining the school's

swimming team or simply socialising with friends at the local beach or swimming centre.

Venus is in the 1st House

Ancient astrologers believe that this is a most auspicious placement of the planet Venus heralding good fortune. Suri is an enchanting child, easily captivating friends and family members with her coquettish demeanour. From a young age Suri is eager to please loved ones. She is affectionate, funny, and entertaining. Family members find it easy to dote on little Suri. Suri likes to feel the warmth and tenderness of loved ones. She is a co-operative child. It is unlikely that parents need to use force with Suri. She is eager to work together. Daily tasks become fun when viewed as a collaborative project. Grooming Suri is rewarding because she enjoys looking her best. After all, an attractive demeanour also attracts positive attention from friends and family.

Colour and beauty play an important role in young Suri's development. She is attracted to beautiful objects and bright colours, both in the home and in nature. She may also enjoy playing dress-ups. In some cases, this strong placement of Venus can mean that Suri has artistic talents. As she grows older, the ability to relate well to other children and adults becomes an asset, helping Suri achieve goodwill and happiness. Her pleasing manner opens many a window of opportunity.

Talents and Schooling

The Sun

The Sun represents your child's identity. It describes your child's basic personality traits and their talents. It also tells you how your children think of themselves; how they need to express themselves; how they need to shine in their lives; how they feel alive. It is the centre of a child's self-expression. The Sun can also tell us about a child's father.

The Sun is in Aries

Headstrong and enterprising are two words that spring to mind when describing an Aries Sun child. Suri is aggressive, impatient, and enthusiastic. She excels at tasks that require initiative and which enable her to be boss. She has a tendency to go headlong into new areas. This can be a little frightening for Suri's parents, who need to encourage Suri to explore new territory while providing safe limits. Otherwise Suri may experience a few head injuries during childhood. Parents also need to teach Suri to take other people's feelings and thoughts into account. This can be done at a young age by gently teaching Suri to share some of her toys, to take turns at certain activities and to consider her friends in play activities. As a result Suri will grow into a talented and successful leader.

Young Suri is independent and able to explore new activities on her own, liking nothing better than to learn and then test her newfound skills. However, she also becomes bored easily and may need to be encouraged to be persistent. This may lead to some frustration and temper tantrums, because patience is not an Aries virtue; however, Suri benefits from a patient and firm hand. Parents may need to find distractions and creative solutions in their teaching efforts rather than meeting Suri head-on. This is also true for childcare workers, kindergarten teachers and school teachers. Ideally Suri's natural initiative and independent spirit is encouraged to shine long into adulthood.

The Sun is in the 3rd House

Suri loves stimulation. As a baby she enjoys colourful surroundings and interacting with siblings or other children. Baby Suri delights in lots of eye contact and "conversations" with other people. She is likely to learn to walk and talk earlier than other children, and enjoys reading from a young age. Suri loves books, magazines, films, videos and computers, anything that helps stimulate her vivid imagination. She may also enjoy writing, drawing, and painting.

Early childhood education is important. Parents and mentors need to carefully choose the right school to ensure that Suri is encouraged to express herself. In this way she can grow and learn and properly develop her talent for exchanging ideas and information. Suri blossoms with the right education. Neighbours may also play a prominent role in young Suri's development, encouraging her to further develop her talent for learning and sharing information. Suri loves the world of ideas and is likely to ask "why?" many times. On the whole Suri enjoys interacting with her siblings. If she is an only child, then other children in the neighbourhood are likely to take the place of siblings.

Although talkative Suri may prefer the company of one or two people rather than crowds. This depends somewhat on the sign of her Sun. A child with the Sun in the sign of Gemini, Libra, Aquarius, Leo or Sagittarius is more likely to be gregarious; whereas a child with the Sun in Cancer, Scorpio, Pisces, Taurus, Virgo, Capricorn or Aries is more likely to enjoy interacting on a one-to-one basis. Either way Suri enjoys company.

Mercury

The planet Mercury describes your children's intellectual abilities. The sign and placement of Mercury can describe whether or not your child finds it easy to concentrate at school. Your child may be a daydreamer or have great concentration. Your child may be shy or interact easily with other people. Either way it is possible to boost your child's self-esteem by choosing study methods and schooling that suits their needs rather than forcing them to fit into an alien environment. Gaining an understanding of the planet Mercury can help in these matters.

Mercury is in Aries

Suri is forthright, learning to talk and read early in her development and quickly developing a reputation for blurting out what she thinks. Suri calls a spade and spade, sometimes embarrassing adults with her honesty. She has an agile mind and is keen to understand matters as soon as possible. Suri simply enjoys the pleasure of coming first in intellectual pursuits. She has a real talent for original thinking and acquiring knowledge. She may also excel at debating, crosswords, and creative writing. Suri has the ability to excel in communication and study, provided she can persevere. Her tendency to make impulsive decisions and to be headstrong may detract from her talents. However, if she can learn to consider the consequences of her decisions then she is a formidable force.

Mercury is in the 2nd House

Little Suri needs the stimulation of different toys, games and other objects. These do not have to be new, but she does need a variety. In fact, young Suri may be quite resourceful at making her props for play. She enjoys having a box full of odds and ends, pretty baubles, dress-up clothes, puzzles, building blocks, games or anything that can keep her busy. Suri is likely to want to play with something the moment that the inspiration takes hold. Therefore it is important for her to have a variety of possessions that can stimulate her mind and imagination. Parents need to use community resources such as libraries and toy libraries if family finances are strained.

As young Suri matures, she is likely to be conscious of the fact that money is important in helping her have all of the things that she needs to pursue her interests. Therefore she is likely to benefit from handling pocket money, perhaps earlier than her peers. She has lots of enterprising ideas for making money and may also be quite good at doing her own saving and banking. Parents need to keep a close watch on any moneymaking escapades that Suri plans with her peers. She may need to be taught business ethics early in life. Young Suri realises, perhaps more so than her peers, the benefits that schooling brings in increasing moneymaking power later in life. Depending on other aspects of her chart, Suri is either eager to further her schooling in order to earn more money in her chosen profession or she is keen to leave school early to get started on the financial gains of working.

The Ascendant

The Ascendant, or Rising Sign as it's sometimes called, is considered to be an important component of an astrology chart. Ancient astrologers believed that the Ascendant depicted a person's primary motivation. Some believed that it was one of the links to discovering what makes a person happy. It could be said that when we're accomplishing our primary motivation then we're happy. By gaining knowledge of a child's Ascendant and discovering this child's primary motivation in life, parents and mentors can then help them achieve their goals. Caring adults can encourage the child with love and support. In turn your child experiences a sense of happiness and fulfilment.

The Ascendant is in Aquarius

Suri is likely to actively seek her purpose in life, taking the initiative rather than waiting until circumstances are comfortable. Aquarius is a Fixed sign denoting fixity of purpose, resolution, self-reliance and independence. However, it also an Air sign indicating a love of ideas, communicating and intellectual prowess.

As a baby Suri may have difficulty settling into a routine, seemingly restless and unsettled. Depending on other aspects of Suri's birth chart, her parents need to forgo the need for a routine in favour of providing stimulation and social contact. Suri is a gregarious child, enjoying interaction with people of all ages. Her parents will be constantly surprised by the original antics of young Suri as she tests her limits.

Suri is independent but her purpose and fate are strongly linked with her friends and associates. For this reason Suri's parents need to encourage plenty of contact with other children, so that Suri can learn about the machinations of human relationships from a young age. Mars

Ambition and drive, like many traits, can be powerful positive forces in your children's lives, helping them achieve their dreams. Too much ambition can hinder your child's ability to collaborate. On the other hand, without motivation your child may not be able to establish a healthy sense of self and successfully leave home and family. Studying Mars, the planet of drive and energy, assists parents and mentors. Mars describes vitality in your child's birth chart. If our children are free to pursue their own dreams and ambitions, their joie de vivre is a wonderful thing to see. By understanding the placement of Mars in your child's chart, you can help support their goals. You gain insight into whether or not your child lacks motivation in certain areas and why. You can also see if your child has an excess of passion. As a result you can either patiently try to motivate your child, or you can provide plenty of stimulation and direction.

Mars is in Cancer

The astrological placement of the planet Mars in the sign of Cancer is not an easy one for young Suri. The fiery energy of Mars is a strange mix with the watery energy of the sign of Cancer. In other words the more upset Suri feels about something, the harder she finds it to express herself or to take action. Therefore, Suri is easily frustrated when trying to achieve her goals. Frustration often results in tears. She needs to be in the right mood before tackling most tasks.

Self-confidence plays a major role in Suri's ability to achieve her goals. If pushed to do something she doesn't want to do then she may dig in her heels or resort to passive behaviour. She seems to lack motivation, more likely to withdraw into a brooding silence rather than pursue her talents. Parents and mentors are probably best advised to leave young Suri alone to sort through her strong feelings, waiting for an opportune moment before approaching her. Anyone who tries to provoke little Suri into action when she is really upset is likely to encounter resistance. Suri can switch from sulking to tears very easily. Although Suri has some trouble following through on her own goals, she is adept at fighting on the behalf of loved ones. She is a real fighter when it comes to looking after younger children, pets, anyone who she loves or anything that she is passionate about. With encouragement Suri learns to direct her emotions in to activities that are emotionally satisfying. She is likely to enjoy activities such as swimming, cooking, sports fishing, sailing and starting her own collection. She may also be motivated, from a young age, to fight for causes such as environmental ones.

Mars is in the 5th House

Suri loves to play. Fun is a major focus of her life. Parents and mentors need to ensure that early childhood is full of pleasure trips, games and social occasions. Otherwise young Suri could become bored, and perhaps despondent. She does not respond well to authoritarian discipline, but rather enjoys entertaining distractions. For this reason school could present a challenge with Suri finding it hard to settle down to a work schedule. However, all is well while Suri enjoys her schoolwork. Suri is creative and industrious in agreeable tasks, but once she loses interest projects are unlikely to be completed. Parents and mentors need to teach young Suri the pleasure that can be gained from completing a task, no matter how tedious it appears to be at times. Suri does not like being in one place for long periods of time. Therefore Suri fares better in an open school environment that encourages creativity and independence. Suri has strong likes and dislikes. She also has a strong reaction to peers, liking some friends, but intensely disliking others. Nevertheless she is likely to be a leader in the playground with her friends looking to her for direction. Suri does not necessarily enjoy this popularity, but is so busy going full steam ahead with her own fun-filled activities that others simply fall in line. This could prove to be a real talent in human resources later in life.

Childhood Journey

Wouldn't it be ideal if we could isolate one trait in our personalities, capture it in a glass for observation and dissection? Of course this is not possible. Neither is it possible for us to isolate one part of a birth chart. The different aspects of our children's birth charts intermingle in a complex manner to make the little person that we know and love. However, it is possible for us to influence the development of our children, to support them in their journey. The aim of this section is to give vital clues for parents and mentors on how to guide, but not coerce, the development of your child.

The Sun is Trine The Moon

A sunny natured child, Suri shines under the influence of this combination of the Sun and Moon. Her mother and father agree that young Suri is special and together they decide on the best methods of raising their wonderful child. Suri is fortunate to spend her early childhood under the nurturing influence of parental harmony. As a result Suri develops a natural curiosity and has the confidence to explore her environment. Suri enjoys new adventures and quickly adapts to changing routines. In fact Suri's eagerness to discover new horizons may lead her into a few scrapes. Her parents need to offer young Suri plenty of freedom, but also keep a watchful eye to make sure she explores within safe limits.

Pluto is Conjunct The Moon

Suri is a sensitive and reflective child with a strong emotional nature. As a baby Suri is likely to form a strong bond with her mother or another important female caregiver. The matriarch of the family features strongly in young Suri's life. This strong bond plays a crucial role in her upbringing. The advantages of this are that Suri enjoys an intensely rewarding relationship with an important woman, which helps her blossom as a young adult. She learns how to express her feelings in a positive manner within a safe and rewarding relationship. In some cases another female caregiver may play a prominent role in young Suri's life. It is also possible that Suri can demand a little too much from the women in her young life, and therefore feel disappointed when someone important fails to live up to her expectations.

There may be times when Suri's mother is undergoing her own emotional ups and downs and is unable to concentrate on Suri's needs. This is the likely time when Suri's intense feelings erupt in the form of tantrums. Therefore it is important that Suri is allowed to express her feelings in a safe manner, but that any manipulative behaviour is not rewarded. Hobbies and pastimes that either demand concentrated effort or that encourage emotional self-expression are important. These could include the dramatic arts, energetic sports, or building models. A pet could also be an ideal way for Suri to learn about the emotional side of relationships.

Mars is Opposite The Moon

The combination of the planet Mars and the Moon is fiery and emotional. Young Suri is likely to have plenty of energy and determination from a young age. A lively child, she delights in exploring new activities. She is independent and does not need the company of other children to keep her amused. Parents delight in the initiative shown by young Suri. They may not be so delighted by Suri's tendency for temper tantrums. Suri really knows how to throw a tantrum. These fits of temper are mostly likely to erupt when Suri's path is obstructed or when her desires are opposed. The positive note is that these outbursts are likely to erupt in a flash and disappear just as quickly. The irony of this situation is that Suri is particularly sensitive to other people's anger, in particular her mother's or other important women in her young life. Suri may also react more strongly to mother's attempts to instil discipline, rather than parenting efforts of father. It is also possible that mother has a temper of her own and clashes with her young charge.

Suri benefits most when independence is encouraged. She needs freedom within safe boundaries. Suri also needs to be encouraged to express her emotions in an appropriate manner. Suri enjoys activities which provide an outlet for her abundant energy. Individual sports, outdoor games or martial arts may be of benefit.

Pluto is Trine The Sun

Suri is a powerful child, challenging herself and those who love her to stand up and take notice of life's abundance. She is curious and keen to explore new territory. If extroverted then young Suri is likely to end up in trouble as a result of her curiosity and resulting adventures into the outside world. She is a real character, a regular Tom Sawyer or Pippi Longstocking. However, a more introverted child may simply enjoy spending time on her own studying the inner workings of toys, nature and/or household equipment.

From the moment of birth Suri's father plays a pivotal role in her life. Her childhood relationship with father, or a strong father figure, determines the extent to which she feels able to carve her own niche later in life. Suri is likely to adore her father as a young child. As the patriarch of the family he earns respect of those surrounding him. A growing child keenly notices this. However, there may be a time when this adoration is transformed by a sense of betrayal. This is not necessarily within father's control. No-one can live up to God-like expectations. However, he can make sure that Suri feels supported as much as possible.

Both Suri and her father have strong personalities and therefore they clash, each determined to express their own views or have their own way. It is important that Suri's father shows self-restraint, otherwise these clashes could become violent. He needs to ensure that young Suri is kept safe, away from emotional, verbal and physical abuse. In other words Suri's father needs to provide a safe environment in which he and Suri can both assert their own wills and gain greater understanding of themselves and each other. If this is not achieved then young Suri loses a sense of her own identity and cowers in the face of adversity. She eventually rebels, probably in her teenage years. However, if Suri's father can allow her the freedom to develop her own powerful personality then young Suri is likely to develop great personal power, the ability to lead others and to achieve her own goals.

The theme of death can also play an important role under this influence. Young Suri is both more sensitive to the grief process and also more able to grow in strength through this process, be it the death of a family member or the death of a pet.

Saturn is Square The Sun

Suri's relationship with her father plays an integral role in her life, probably from the moment of birth. It is even possible that young Suri has been named after her father or the father's family's name, or a close friend of her father, or that her father chose her name. Hence the bond starts at birth. This bond can be a positive one in the long term; however, it is possible that Suri's father is initially somewhat strict or oppressive. Perhaps he feels protective of young Suri, not realising that all young people need freedom to explore. Or perhaps he is simply a disciplinarian with difficulty expressing the love that is in his heart. Either way Suri is likely to feel limited in her self-expression as a child, particularly before the age of 14. As a result her self-esteem could suffer. She may be a serious and somewhat shy child. It is important that Suri's father, or father figure's in her life express a lot of praise and affection to help balance the discipline. This way Suri grows into a well-balanced young person, secure in the knowledge of her ability to achieve her goals with the support of important men in her life. She will have the self-discipline to succeed. In some cases it is not Suri's father that takes this stern role, but another adult male in her life. Therefore all of the above would apply to this man, not her father. It is also possible that problems can be experienced early in life because of Suri's relationship with her father or a father figure. If this is the case then it is likely that Suri will face these challenges, grow in wisdom and achieve success later in life, particularly from the age of 29 years.

Uranus is Semisquare The Sun

From the moment Suri is born, family life takes a different direction. In fact even her birth may have taken her parents by surprise and challenged family members to make changes. Suri is one of a kind. She is a restless baby, fed up with inactivity and eager to be on the move. It is true that Suri is easily bored. She quickly outgrows activities, friends and even family members. She may not enjoy cuddles and the safety of a warm home, but rather takes pleasure in exploring new things. Suri enjoys doing things on her own, as well as playing with others. However, she is more likely to be a leader than a follower. She is also likely to be impulsive and determined to have her own way. Young Suri can be quite stubborn. This can cause friction with any adult in a position of responsibility, particularly men.

Suri's father, or a father figure, plays an important role in her life. In some cases her father may have an unusual occupation or hobby that takes him away from his family responsibilities. Or perhaps Suri's father is absent at a crucial stage of her development. As a result Suri may become rebellious, even uncontrollable for a period. In other cases, it may simply be that her father is an independent person capable of encouraging Suri's independent spirit in a positive manner. It is important that Suri's father provide safe limits for little Suri's explorations so that she can discover new activities without taking unnecessary risks. Suri's father, or a father figure, needs to have an abundance of patience as she tests the limits.

Saturn is Trine Mercury

Now here's a child who needs a lot of approval and support, particularly from her father or an important male mentor. The more love and kindness that Suri receives, the more she is able to express herself in her daily life with confidence. The reason for this is that the combination of the planets Saturn and Mercury can be a difficult one, presenting some pitfalls in early childhood development. In other words young Suri may face difficulties in her ability to learn and communicate. This, in turn, affects her self-confidence.

Suri may be shy, preferring the safety of her home rather than venturing out and about. Suri could be slow to talk and read. Perhaps school seems a bit overwhelming to young Suri. She prefers to spend time reading in her own room rather than socialising with her friends. Suri is sensitive to criticism, particularly any harsh words from her father or a prominent male member of the family. On the other hand Suri slowly blossoms when praised by her father. She also responds well to a male mentor's patient words of wisdom. Suri needs a slow, methodical approach when being given any instructions. She works better within a structured environment. With calm handling Suri gradually gains self-understanding and a wisdom that is beyond her years. Another positive note that is most of Suri's learning difficulties are experienced in her early youth. As she matures, social and communication skills and study becomes easier. It is almost as if Suri is born with a greater intelligence that needs to be carefully nurtured during childhood in order for it to be fully expressed as she matures.

As Suri grows older, she is likely to excel in a specialised subject of her choice. Her selection of topic depends on other aspects of her birth chart. Parents need to make sure that Suri is able to choose her own study topics as much as is possible. Excessive parental control could have a detrimental effect, eroding Suri's budding self-confidence. It is interesting to note that the famous scientist Albert Einstein experienced learning difficulties at school, and yet later rose to prominence in his field. Einstein had a powerful combination (conjunction) of the planets Saturn and Mercury in his birth chart. The strength of this association depends on the nature of the astrological link. Parents may wish to consult an astrologer.

Neptune is Semisquare Mercury

The combination of the planets Neptune and Mercury is a challenging one. The extent of the challenge depends on the exact nature of the association and other influences in Suri's birth chart. However, the planet Mercury represents communication, which is overshadowed somewhat by the planet Neptune. Therefore Suri finds it difficult to express herself in conventional ways. Parents and mentors help Suri find more unorthodox ways in which to express herself such as through the creative arts. Art, poetry, theatre, dance and music can

prove highly beneficial forms of expression. Suri is a daydreamer, often forgetful around the home. This can be frustrating for family members, who need to exercise plenty of patience. Suri is often apprehensive, fearing criticism for her absent-minded ways. She needs parents, and family members, to acknowledge her many gifts, even if they are not conventional ones. Suri does not respond well to force.

Suri is intuitive, kind and loving. She is quick to care for those in need. Suri is imaginative and enjoys stories such as fairy tales, myths and legends. She may also have a talent for making up her own stories. Parents and mentors need to ensure that young Suri understands the difference between fantasy and reality. Suri may prefer to live in a fantasy world rather than face the demands of daily responsibilities. She is highly impressionable.

Positive influences are important in order for Suri to develop her self-esteem. Parents and mentors need to take special care in choosing a school for young Suri. She needs a school environment that encourages creativity, rather than purely academic achievement. Friendships also play an important role in helping or hindering Suri's sensitive nature. Therefore, it is important for parents to encourage friendships that have only a positive influence. With the right encouragement Suri grows in self-confidence and finds the means to express her unique gifts.

Jupiter is Trine Venus

Good fortune smiles on Suri. The two positive planets of Venus and Jupiter have combined to bring happiness, comfort and joy. Suri has many friends and family members who shower her with gifts and money. Loved ones are also happy to shower her with affection and favours.

Suri is surrounded with tenderness and kindness. Growing up in warm and loving surroundings is certainly an advantage for young Suri. She is happy and secure and able to adjust well to the different stages of childhood development. She forms friendships easily and is eager to share her good fortune. School is a happy experience. Suri is popular and creative. Academic success depends largely on other factors in Suri's birth chart. However, parents are proud of Suri's generous and fun-loving nature, and her ability to form positive associations. Mentors, particularly mother figures, need only beware of overindulging young Suri. If Suri is too comfortable then she may become lazy, waiting for others to provide inspiration rather than attaining her own goals. However, it is more likely that young Suri's enthusiasm stands her in good stead for reaching her own objectives with plenty of co-operation from willing friends and family members.

Uranus is Conjunct Venus

What a little live wire! Suri needs plenty of liberty to express her independence. Naturally inquisitive, she does not like to be tied down, but prefers to be free to explore her own interests. As such little Suri's parents need to be very flexible with routines and social engagements.

Spontaneity is the key to successfully raising young Suri. She loves surprises. She is a unique little individual with many and varied interests and friends. Suri also has a tendency to act first and think later. This results in some exciting, if somewhat risky, adventures and activities. These may involve electricity, chemistry, fireworks or some sort

of experiment with a difference. She can enjoy adventures on her but usually she likes to involve her friends in her escapades. Parents need to direct Suri's excess energy into lively, but safe, activities. Benefits can be gained from enrolling young Suri in children's sports or social clubs.

As Suri grows older, she needs to be free to choose her friends and some of them might be quite unusual. Any interference from her parents is likely to be met with mutiny. Parents would be well advised to give Suri her freedom, unless her friendships are particularly unsavoury. She enjoys many different friends during the course of her childhood. It takes some time for her to learn the value of commitment. This depends, of course, on other aspects of her birth chart. In rare cases this combination of the planets Venus and Uranus can indicate a child who has a very unusual hobby or pastime that replaces her need for playmates.

Neptune is Sesquisquare Mars

The combination of the planets Mars and Neptune is difficult for young children. It takes Suri a little longer than other children to find her direction in life. Therefore she needs plenty of support, patience and as many opportunities to try different activities. This is a time when it is appropriate for a child to be given permission to end an activity that is not satisfying. Commitment comes later in life, once Suri has found her true passion. Of course it is always possible that young Suri is a child prodigy displaying a talent for music, art, dance, acting, or even swimming, diving or skiing at a young age. However, it more likely that Suri is a daydreamer and somewhat lacking in enthusiasm for the more structured childhood activities. Suri is likely to benefit from taking part in water sports, gymnastics or being taught artistic crafts.

It is possible that Suri's father influences her life, either through her absent-minded manner or by inspiring her with his own talents. It is also possible that Suri has a close relationship with a grandmother, who introduces her to new and different projects. Either way Suri is not likely to follow a conventional path. She needs lots of reassurance and support for her unique talents. Otherwise she could become easily discouraged, trailing other children in the different stages of childhood development. However, a kind and loving heart and a gentle approach to discipline go a long way in assisting young Suri to enjoy her journey towards adulthood.

Pluto is Opposite Mars

Woe betide anyone who stands in the way of young Suri. She may appear docile, but underneath she has an iron will. Those closest to Suri recognise that she knows what she desires and is unlikely to let anyone or anything stand in her way. This trait can be seen at a very early age. Suri doesn't like to be thwarted and has quite a temper. It is not always apparent and can erupt out of the blue. This presents quite a challenge for Suri's parents, who need to teach her that tantrums and other manipulative forms of behaviour are not the way to achieve her goals. Suri has to learn that getting her own way is not the most important thing in life. Co-operation and consideration are also valuable. Of course, the extent of Suri's forceful manner does depend on other aspects of her birth chart. However, childhood development is likely to be strewn with some dramatic lessons. It is also vital that Suri's parents, in particular her father, avoid physical punishment. Suri responds adversely to force, and also needs to learn how to manage conflict as well as possible.
